<b>CAMERA SIGNAGE AND TYPES OF DATA PROCESSED</b>	
<p>The video surveillance system is appropriately signaled in a visible manner through specific signs, in compliance with the General Provision on Video Surveillance issued by the Italian Data Protection Authority on April 8, 2010. The Data Controller will process the images viewed and/or recorded by the video surveillance system of individuals accessing the company premises and external access areas.</p>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Ensuring the safety of company personnel and individuals accessing company areas;</li> <li>- Protecting company assets and property against potential assaults, thefts, robberies, vandalism, or any other unlawful acts;</li> <li>- Verifying the security of certain operational zones to safeguard assets and ensure the safety of operators engaged in loading and unloading activities.</li> </ul>	<p align="center">Legitimate interest.</p>	<p>The images contained in video recordings are ordinarily retained for a maximum of 48 hours from the time of capture, except for special circumstances requiring extended retention due to holidays, office closures, or specific investigative requests from judicial authorities or law enforcement agencies. After this period, the images will be automatically deleted through overwriting with new recordings.</p>

	<b>DATA PROVISION</b> <p>Refusal to provide data will result in the inability to access video-surveilled areas. Access to such areas entails the collection, recording, retention, and general use of the images of the individuals concerned.</p>

	<b>DATA RECIPIENTS</b> <p>Data may be accessed by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- The Data Controller;</li> <li>- Employees and collaborators of the Data Controller who, under its authority, perform processing activities in accordance with their respective duties. A list of authorized individuals is available at the Data Controller's premises.</li> </ul> <p>The data may also be processed by entities designated as data processors, such as companies providing monitoring and surveillance services and/or maintenance services for the video surveillance system. The data may be disclosed to public entities authorized to request the data, such as judicial authorities and/or law enforcement agencies.</p>

## RIGHTS OF DATA SUBJECTS - COMPLAINT TO THE SUPERVISORY AUTHORITY

Data subjects may:

- Request access to the images from the Data Controller;
- Object to the processing;
- Request the restriction of processing and/or deletion of data, where applicable.

The right to update, integrate, or rectify data under Article 16 of the GDPR is not applicable due to the intrinsic nature of the data processed (real-time images concerning objective facts).

Similarly, the right to data portability under Article 20 of the GDPR is not applicable, as the processing is carried out based on the legitimate interest of the Data Controller.

The data subject may request to view images in which they believe they were captured by presenting or attaching appropriate identification documents to their request. Responses to access requests cannot include data related to third parties unless the separation or removal of certain elements renders the personal data of the data subject incomprehensible.

Once the retention period has expired, it will no longer be possible to fulfill access requests.

Data subjects may also lodge a complaint with the Italian Data Protection Authority using the procedures indicated on its official website.
